Today's Visitors



Ngaruawahia United was formed in 1968 by Ngaruawahia teacher **Joe Templeton**, mainly from players attending his High School.

Due to a lack of numbers, no competition was entered into until the 1969 season, when the team competed in the Waikato B Division.

Amalgamation with Northern League neighbours AFFCo Rangers in 1977 saw Ngaruawahia gain painless entry into the Northern League. Also in the same year the two-level clubrooms were built, almost entirely by the club membership.

The middle field at Centennial Park was the original No.1 pitch with the current No.2 field sporting two large ancient Māori food-pits. These pits were filled, the trees between the two pitches removed, the 200mm concrete cricket wicket under the central field uplifted and the club had two playing surfaces.

The current No.1 ground was originally designated "cemetery" and was used by a local farmer for his tomatoes!

In the 1980s the club and council combined to prepare that "tomato patch" as another playing surface and, with the later hosting of Waikato FC over the 2008-2009 summer season, Ngaruawahia had the beginnings of a very good playing strip.

Ngaruawahia moved up and down the Northern League tables over the years from Div. 4 South to Premiers.

A club highlight was reached in 1998 when the senior team met Dunedin Technical in the Chatham Cup semi-finals (losing 0-2) in Dunedin.

In 2008 Centennial Park became the home ground of the WaikatoFC franchise. Improvements were made to the changing rooms, the pitch and the clubrooms.

The 2009-10 summer league saw an increase of Waikato-based players playing for their province.

A penalty after 70 minutes was the turning point in this Northern League Division Two match in which Cambridge lost to Auckland rivals Western Springs.

Neither side created any real goalscoring chances until Bryan Pepper scored for Western Springs after 39 minutes.

With the score 1-0 to the visitors, and a driving wind behind them in the second half, Cambridge were pressing to get back into the game when referee Glen House judged that home skipper Blair Cooper had brought down a Western Springs attacker.

Cooper was given a second yellow card, forcing his dismissal from the pitch, and the division's second highest goalscorer, Leo Berlim, netted for the visitors.

That goal, and Cambridge's loss of a key player, led to the visitors' third goal, from Craig Taylor in the 80th minute.

Two minutes later, Western Springs had the chance to further extend their lead when referee House gave another penalty, judging that substitute Malcolm Matthews had fouled in the area.

Berlim scored from his first attempt but was ordered to retake the spot kick and Cambridge goalkeeper Ryan McNamara dived full length to save.

Cambridge's player of the day was defender Nathan Claridge who overcame the flu to deliver a hardworking performance while McNamara was his usual dependable self between the posts.

in the 5-aside tournament, 2009 they were plate winners of their satellite tournament and 2010, obviously, qualifying for Nationals but also maintaining a top 3 spot in the Premier Division so far.

Through all the hard work the players have put in a well deserving place at the National tournament would suffice, the girls have created a very strong bond between one another and believe this is why they have come this far.

Several fundraisers have been created to send the girls down to Nelson. So far the girls have done raffles, market days, candyfloss sales and a 10km run.
