## Our opponents

**Fencibles United AFC is one of the largest soccer clubs in New Zealand with about 140 teams including junior, youth, senior men and women grades at all levels.**

The club is based in Pakuranga/Howick, Auckland, and their main home ground is Riverhills Park. The club grew from the 1995 amalgamation of two East Auckland clubs, Pakuranga Town AFC and Howick AFC.

The adoption of Fencibles United as the name for the club recognised the Fencibles as the historic link between the two clubs and identifies with the locality. The Fencibles were the first European settlers in the region. The name Fencible refers to the Royal New Zealand Fencibles Corps. Fencible is derived from the word Defencible, meaning capable of defence.

The Fencible Corp was recruited men who had served in the military for Britain in the 1830s – 1840s. They were offered a new life in New Zealand, including a free passage for families, a cottage and an acre of land to become theirs after the completion of a seven year term, in return for military duties. These soldiers/settlers had a dual role as labourers/farmers/settlers and as a



military defence force if required.

The largest of the Fencible settlements was established in 1847 at the site of what was later to be called Howick (named after Lord Howick, secretary of the Colonies, who was responsible for the Fencible Corp's immigration to New Zealand). The Fencibles were responsible for maintaining the security of the locality and were part of a defensive chain that extended through Pakuranga, Panmure, Otahuhu and Onehunga to protect the city of Auckland. While the main settlement was on the site of what is now Howick, there were houses and homesteads built at strategically important locations such as Pakuranga.

The club playing strip of red, blue with white trim also reflects the uniforms of the Royal New Zealand Fencibles Corps.

Able to play on either side of the defence, and in a central role if required, Fisher was a hard-working member of last year's squad, who never stopped trying, no matter how tough the game.

### Peter Loyd Centre back/Midfielder, 18

Broke into the first team last season, and scored a memorable winner against Hibiscus Coast. A technically gifted player, he's still learning the game and has much potential. He's now developing into a useful central defender.

A recent arrival from the UK, where he played for Hawkwell Athletic, this hardworking youngster performed well in pre-season and looks to be a first-team regular of the future.

**Scott Parsonage****Midfielder, 27**

The workhorse of Cambridge's midfield, Parsonage led by example last season with his non-stop running and organisation in the middle. A Level 2 qualified coach, he's also coaching the club's U15s in the new Waikato Youth League.

**Josh Clark****Defender, 15**

Quick and skillful, Clark has graduated to first team football via Cambridge High School and our club's C team. He captains the club's Under 15 side.

**Ed Kettle****Midfielder, 26**

Former Havelock North player Kettle joined Cambridge at the start of 2011, and quickly became a regular in the Federation 2 side. When he got his chance to feature in the

first team, he quickly showed he could add some steel to the central midfield.

**Lee McNally****Coach, 40**

The veteran of this squad, McNally took over as player-coach of the side part-way through this season. Unfortunately a broken ankle against Ngaruawahia has curtailed his playing role and he'll now concentrate on coaching.
