Cambridge Football Club has landed a national award alongside some of the sport's biggest names.

While the All Whites, coach Ricky Herbert and superstar player Ryan Nelsen were picking up more trophies at soccer's glitzy annual awards dinner in Auckland, our local club was recognised for publishing the best official match programme in the country.

"We were delighted to win," said programme editor Josh Easby. "It proves that clubs outside of the main centres can force their way into getting national recognition."

It's the second time in a month that the club has earned recognition for its off-field activities after its junior section recently won a community award.

The club began publication of its 16-page match programme last season as a requirement of its participation in the Northern Regional League and judges from the New Zealand Soccer Media Association picked Cambridge for the award after seeing samples from three issues.

The victory is the first time Cambridge has won a national award, and the award gave the Waikato-Bay of Plenty Federation its only club



achievement at this year's dinner.

Editor Easby said the programme would not have been possible without the support of sponsor Ricoh whose excellent photocopiers enabled the club to produce a high quality publication without the need for commercial printing.

Meanwhile, Cambridge has set itself the goal of trying to improve the publication so it can retain its award-winning status next year.

The award is Cambridge FC's second of the current season after its hardworking junior section won a prestigious award recognising their achievements.

Bryan and Maree Woodall proudly collected the best Sport and Leisure trophy at the TrustPower Waipa District Community Awards announced in early May.

Defender, 15

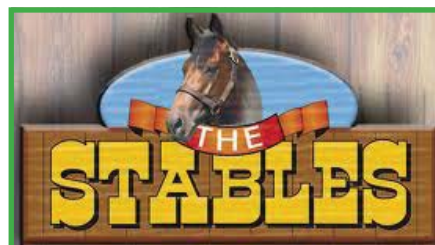
Quick and skillful, Clark has graduated to first team football via Cambridge High School and our club's C team.

Ngaruawahia 4 Cambridge 1

A broken ankle suffered by player coach Lee McNally helped turn this local derby into a miserable day for Cambridge's Northern League side.

The Cambridge side started well and the game was evenly poised until McNally cracked his ankle when challenging for the ball in the 20th minute, forcing changes to his side's midfield.

Rory Kerr-Bell put Ngaruawahia ahead after 40 minutes with a long-range shot over the head of 'keeper Cale Villiger. But with only a goal between them, Cambridge came out for the second half believing they could overhaul their opponents.

Their hopes took a dent only four minutes into the second half when a ball into the penalty area skidded off the wet turf and onto the hand of substitute Malcolm Matthews, leading referee Bruce Horrox to award a penalty. Ngaruawahia skipper Sean Sullivan scored from the spot.

Tim Kautai put Ngaruawahia further ahead after an hour but Cambridge's Trent Frampton pulled the score back to 3-1 with an outstanding goal in the 67th minute. Having

controlled a through ball and turned his defender, Frampton clipped the ball high into the net from 20 metres for his spectacular strike.

Cambridge pushed forward but Ngaruawahia scored their fourth through Matt Rose to seal the points for the home side.

Cambridge's centre back pairing of Simon Mead and Adrian Clark were excellent with the latter named as the side's Man of the Match.

Cambridge 1 Hibiscus Coast 3

Cambridge went down fighting in a torrid fixture against Hibiscus Coast who, with more than 1,100 players, are one of New Zealand's largest football clubs.

After a break the previous weekend, Cambridge had almost their full squad free of injury and fielded a strong starting line-up which held the visitors scoreless for the opening 40 minutes.

During that spell, honours were even and feisty tackling kept Coast contained though referee Gerard Boyce booked four Cambridge players, all for tackling offences.

With five minutes to go to the break, a mix-up in the Cambridge

defence led to a clumsy tackle and the awarding of a penalty that was calmly scored by Coast's leading goalscorer Rafi Mohammadi.

The penalty was the turning point in the game and the visitors came out firing in the second half, quickly adding two more goals through Mohammadi to give him a hat-trick and equal billing in the division's golden boot tally.

Cambridge showed character and had the better of the last half hour, pulling a goal back when Trent Frampton cleverly lobbed over the 'keeper from 20 metres. Chances fell to skipper Scott Parsonage and Andrew Taylor but Coast held on to their lead to take the points.

Goalkeeper Cale Villiger was outstanding, making several athletic saves, while midfielder Denny Commins worked hard for 90 minutes. Taylor was Cambridge's player of the day.
